



YELLOWSTONE GATEWAY PROTECTION ACT TO RECEIVE SENATE HEARING

On July 12 and 13, Karrie Kahle, Jeff Reed and Orion Watson, representing the Yellowstone Gateway Business Coalition, traveled to Washington, D.C. to meet with elected officials and agencies about protecting the Gateway to Yellowstone from industrial gold mining. Karrie Kahle of Chico Hot Springs reflects on the trip and the recent announcement that the Yellowstone Gateway Protection Act, S.941 will receive a congressional hearing in D.C. on Wednesday July 26 beginning at 8:00 a.m Mountain Standard Time.

“We appreciate the in-depth conversations that myself and several of our members had with the entire Montana delegation on the need to permanently protect public lands at Yellowstone’s gateway from mining. We’re grateful for progress on the Yellowstone Gateway Protection Act. The announcement that the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee will hold a hearing on July 26 represents a very important step forward. Sen. Daines sits on this important committee, and we urge the committee to continue progress to permanently protect the doorstep to Yellowstone by advancing this legislation.”
